Open Source ?

- I am doubting the existence of the final integrated definition of it.
- What is the definition?
 - Neglect people with Mac OS and people who believe the importance of platform independence?
 - For me, free software is different from open source
 - NOT because free software is more philosophical
 - Because I care the future platform selection
 - Linux is NOT the last and the final winner
- Open Source = "Linux" 100% ?
- There *ARE* platform independent open sources

From the History in Asia 21st century for forming the Asia

- Politically,
 - 19c: "awaking Asia", 20c: "upheavals and disturbance" ("No Peace in Asia" in 1947), 21c:" Forming the Asia"
- Economically,
 - After the WW2, "The Miracle of Asia", then Mosaic and mixture of factors for instability and stability, then Asia Financial Crisis in 1997.
 - Export oriented vs Domestic demand oriented
 - 9/11 then SARS:New Governmental Role, US centric globalization to Regional Strength (FTA, ...)

We are in a very early stage on seeking for a new industry model to share

- Not yet for business models
- Not yet for making the standard

To call it a market, standard specification should be in the core. (and many implementations to compete)
